PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The 4-H Beef Project allows youth to study and learn about all aspects of the beef industry. Discover more about animal science, beef production and marketing. Youth will:

- Learn basic principles of animal science by owning and/ or caring for one or more head of cattle
- Identify quality and nutritional value in wholesale and retail cuts of animal products and understand their relationship to management practices of live animals
- Learn the value of scientific research and its influence upon animals in the meat industry

LIFE SKILLS

- Use critical thinking, problem solving and decision making skills to make good decisions about project management
- Practice resiliency through successes and challenges in your project
- Develop skills through the responsibilities and management practices involved with livestock

LEADERSHIP

- Organize an educational activity related to the beef project
- Assist an educator or volunteer in developing a livestock or meat evaluation team
- Volunteer to host a tour at your project location

COMMUNICATION

- Present a demonstration on proper beef preparation
- Interview a local producer about their practices
- Create a presentation on developing rations for proper beef nutrition

GROW IN YOUR BEEF PROJECT

The activities below are ideas to inspire project development. This is not a complete list.

BEGINNER

- Identify beef cattle breeds
- Know desirable qualities for project selection
- Explore parts of the animal and cuts of meat
- Learn the importance of halter breaking calves and basic grooming practices
- Understand why feeding your animal is important
- Develop basic showmanship techniques

INTERMEDIATE

- Develop live evaluation and meat grading skills
- Identify common health issues in cattle and how to properly treat them
- Practice safe cattlehandling techniques
- Use proper stalling practices
- Further your knowledge of cuts of meat and purposes of each part of the beef animal carcass

ADVANCED

- Utilize EPDs in herd management and sire selection
- Explore programs used to develop beef rations and understand the importance of various feedstuffs
- Research methods and value of using artificial insemination (AI) practices
- Evaluate how the quality of a carcass can affect its marketability

EXPAND YOUR EXPERIENCE

- Become involved with the Oklahoma Junior Cattlemen's Association or other state or national beef organizations
- Visit a feed mill to learn how feeds are weighed, mixed and packaged
