OKLAHOMA 4-H CHILDCARE PROJECT



PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The 4-H childcare project allows youth to understand and appreciate how children grow and develop. Youth will learn the roles they and parents play in the development of children. 4-H'ers also will gain critical skills needed while caring for children. Youth will:

- Explore ways to personally use childcare knowledge
- Become an advocate for children, parents and early childhood issues
- Discover childcare career opportunities
- Learn basic babysitting skills

GROW IN YOUR CHILDCARE PROJECT

The activities below are ideas to inspire project development. This is not a complete list.

BEGINNER

- Self-evaluate if you have the characteristics of a good babysitter
- Learn ages and developmental stages of childhood
- Identify safe practices for children and yourself
- Research age-appropriate and stimulating activities for children

INTERMEDIATE

- Create age-appropriate children's books and games
- Assemble your own childcare kits with necessary supplies
- Train to be CPR certified
- Present a workshop on childcare
- Research current childcare issues and share your findings with the general public

LIFE SKILLS

- Become self-directive and productive
- Accept diverse family structures
- Practice safety and personal discipline

LEADERSHIP

- Be a youth volunteer with the 4-H Cloverbud program
- Work with a certified 4-H volunteer to organize a day camp for children
- Volunteer at a certified childcare facility

COMMUNICATION

- Give a demonstration or presentation about proper infant and child CPR
- Prepare an educational display over a basic first aid kit
- Give a radio or news broadcast over safe child practices
- Create a puppet show to teach children about Internet safety

ADVANCED

- Learn about different disabilities that create unique needs for children and adults
- Track children's responses to selected activities
- Observe professional childcare facilities
- Understand multiple aspects of starting/ managing a childcare business

EXPAND YOUR EXPERIENCE

- Job shadow a professional in an area of childcare
- Consult a dietitian about planning and preparing meals for children with special diets
- Work with your local Extension educator to present a babysitting workshop or clinic
