PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The Apparel Design & Construction project allows youth to gain the skills and knowledge needed to construct, repurpose and modify clothing and accessories. Youth also develop consumer skills to select fabrics, notions and equipment. Youth will:

- Learn proper care of clothing and textiles
- Apply principles of design and function in apparel and accessories
- Build self-confidence by creating clothing and accessories that are flattering and express the member's personality and lifestyle.

GROW IN YOUR APPAREL DESIGN & CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

The activities below are ideas to inspire project development. This is not a complete list.

BEGINNER

- Learn parts of a sewing machine
- Practice how to wind a bobbin and thread a sewing machine
- Assemble a sewing kit
- Learn how to do straight and zig zag stitching
- Learn to sew on a button
 and snap
- Make a simple bottom and top with elastic casing and hem

INTERMEDIATE

- Learn a variety of seam and hem finishes
- Develop skills in matching plaids and stripes
- Learn about different types of fabric weaves, fiber characteristics and care of different fibers
- Explore construction techniques such as knitting, crocheting and no-sew projects

- Teach others how to thread a sewing machine
- Serve as an officer in your Apparel Design and Construction club

- Give a demonstration on the parts of a sewing machine
- Develop an exhibit showcasing types of textile fibers and their characteristics
- Develop written instructions for a pattern you designed

ADVANCED

- Design a pattern and create a garment
- Practice techniques such as lining and tailoring
- Design or modify a garment for a person with special needs
- Research sewing machines
 and other equipment
 - Explore home-based business opportunities related to design and construction

EXPAND YOUR EXPERIENCE

- Tour a textiles mill or clothing construction manufacturer
- Job shadow an employee in a fabric or retail store
- Work with a local clothing resale store to design a window display for the current fashion season or trend
