- * Basic first aid kit
- * map(s) of the area
- * Extra cash
- * Spare changes of clothes
- * Pet supplies
- * Copies of personal documents
- * Spare keys to car/home
- * 1 gallon of water per person per day(3 day supply)
- * 3 day supply non-perishable
- * Battery-powered or hand-crank radio
- * Cell phone and chargers
- * Flashlight with extra batteries
- * Sanitation, personal hygiene, blankets
- * Other tools or equipment
